MODERN CHINESE LAUNDRIES USE MAXWELL TRUCKS.

Perhaps the oldest customs and most ancient traditions come from China, and yet in the past few years this historic race has made rapid strides in modern methods. The greatest turning point came when the vast empire disappeared in favor of a republic and with the old dynasty went the picturesque braided queue of the Chinaman. Their activity in this country is most noticeable in the Far West and especially in California, where they reside in large numbers and have in many localities achieved high respect and notable business success. Chinese laundries are far more numerous than in the Eastern cities and in the matter of vegetables and garden truck the Chinese merchant have developed an elaborate business that feeds a very large part of the white population.

MODERATE SPEED IN TRUCKS.

Tires Show the Excellent Results of Consideration.

"Running true, at excessive speed is a common fault among truck drivers," says R.S. Wilson, manager of the solid tire department of the Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company.

"The effect is the same as running them over rough roads, for speeding magnifies every irregularity. The tires absorb the shocks when the truck is operated at the recommended rate of speed, but increasing the speed greatly increases the force of the shocks. For instance, doubling the speed makes the force of these shocks four times as great."

THE OVERLAND.

The new Overland four, for which the public has been waiting with much interest since the chassis was introduced in the January show last year, stands out prominently as a feature of the Auto Shows this year. The new eight Overland four would have been put on the market last spring, but the huge part taken by the Willys-Overland Company in the manufacture of war supplies made necessary the abandonment of the introduction of this car until this year.






