MARTIN, ALEXANDER (Queen's, P.E.I.).

S. of the late Alex. Martin, of Springton, P.E.I., who emigrated to P.E.I. from Uigg, Isle of Skye, in 1830. Mother was Isabella, dau. of the late Alex. Martin, of Belle Creek, P.E.I. B. at Springton in 1842. Ed. in the Common Schools and Normal School. M., 1859, Anne, dau, of the late Roderick McLeod, of Uigg, P.E.I. Taught school for nine years; is now a merchant and farmer. Sat in the House of Assem, of P.E.I. from 1884 to 1886, and in the Leg. Co. from 1886 to 1889, when he resigned and was an unsuccessful candidate for the House of Assem. First returned to Parlt. at g. e., 1896. A Conservative. In favor of the unity of the Empire and the maintenance of British connection by Canada; the development of the national resources of Canada; the protection and encouragement of native industry; extension of trade by extending and perfecting steam communication, and fair and equitable treaties with Great Britain and other countries, strongly in favor of a preferential trade treaty with Great Britain, and so far back as 1887, in the Leg. Co., P.E.I., introduced a resolution advocating a 5 per cent. differential duty.-Valleyfield, P.E.I.
