

Union of the Provinces, 1867. Appointed a mem. of the Queen's Privy Council and Minister of Public Works for the Dominion, 1 July, 1867. (Salary, \$5,000.) Created C. B. (Civil) by Her Majesty the Queen, 1867. Is a Commissioner to assist Mr. Speaker in the Internal Economy of the House of Commons. Was Chairman of the Commission appointed to open trade relations with the West Indies, Mexico and Brazil, 1865-6. Was a delegate to the Charlottetown Union Conference, 1864; to that at Quebec, in the same year; and to the Colonial Conference in London to complete terms of Union of B. N. A. Colonies, 1866-7. Delegate to Eng., with Sir G. E. Cartier, 1868-9, to confer with Imperial authorities on the defences of the Dominion and for the acquisition of the North-West territory, on which occasion elected an honorary mem. of the Reform Club. Sat for North Oxford, R., in L. A., Can., from 1858 until 1863; for North Ontario from g. e., 1863, until July, 1864; and for present seat from Nov., 1864, until the Union. Returned to Commons by acclamation a tlast g. e. Was an unsuccessful candidate for North Wentworth, 1854; for Waterloo at g. e. same year; and for Perth at g. e., 1857. Pop. 12,667.—*Daly Street, Ottawa; Millbank, Toronto.*

MCDougALL, WILLIAM. [*Three Rivers.*] C.

Second s. of John McDougall, Esq., merchant, who sat for Drummond in the L. A., Can., from 1851 to 1854. B. in Scot., 1831. Accompanied his parents to Can. when very young. Called to the Bar, L. C., Jan., 1851. Was an unsuccessful candidate for present seat at g. e., 1863. First returned to Parlt. Oct., 1868 (on resignation of sitting mem.), by acclamation. Pop., 6,058.
