so far as the interests of this House are concerned, and to act on behalf of this House as members of the Joint Committee of both Houses on the Library.

Ordered, That the said Resolution be communicated to the House of Commons by one of the Masters in Chancery.

Then on motion of the Honorable Mr. Hamilton (Kingston), seconded by the Honorable Mr. Holmes,

The House adjourned.
