servation of the peace, and whatsoever is or may be by them cognizable, according to the Criminal Laws in force in this Province, and the terms of the said Court of General Session of the Peace shall be as follows, that is to say: from the to the of and from the to the inclusively, day of Sundays and obligatory holidays always excepted. Provided always, that no trial for any criminal offence shall take place or be held by the said Court, until a legal Gaol shall be established in the said Inferior District.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the said Court of General Session of the Peace, shall have cognizance, and have power to hear, try and determine during the terms, according to Law, any suit or action purely personal, wherein the amount claimed may not exceed ten pounds, sterling, any Law or Statute heretofore in force in this Province to the contrary notwithstanding, and until a Court House can be erected for the said Inferior District, the said Court shall be held and sit in such house or building as the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of the Province for the time being shall thereunto direct and appoint.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that there shall be appointed a Clerk to the said Court for the said Inferior District, who shall be entitled to receive for his services such fees as by Law appertain to his situation and none other.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that in every suit or action decided in the said Court, which shall relate to any fee of office, duty, rent, revenue or sum of money payable to His Majesty, where the rights in future, relating to any real property or otherwise, may be bound or affected, an appeal shall lie to His Majesty's Court of King's Bench for the District of Montreal, the party agrieved, presenting a summary petition to that effect, stating the matters of fact to the said Court, or to any Judge thereof in term or vacation, praying that the record and proceedings in such suit or action may be transmitted from the said Court in the aforesaid Inferior District, into the said Court of King's Bench, to the end that the same may be revised, and judgement be thereupon given according to Law.

VI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that no such appeal shall lie nor be granted, unless the same be notified and applied for, to the eldest Justice of the Peace, presiding in the said Court where trial may have taken place, within fifteen days after
