RETURN of the Number of Emigrants who have Embarked from the various Ports of the United Kingdom during the Year 1842; showing to what Parts of the World they have Emigrated:—Also, a Return of the Number who have been assisted to Emigrate by Funds derived from Poor Rate; the Number who have been assisted to Emigrate by the Commissioners of Land and Emigration, and from what Funds such Assistance has been derived; the Amount of Land sold by the Commissioners, the Price obtained, and the Purposes to which the Proceeds have been applied; the Number who have been enabled to Emigrate by means of Bounties payable in the Colonies; distinguishing in the above Returns, so far as is practicable, the Number of Emigrants of each Sex, and the Number of Adults from the Number of Children, and the Colony, or Portion thereof, to which such Returns refer.
