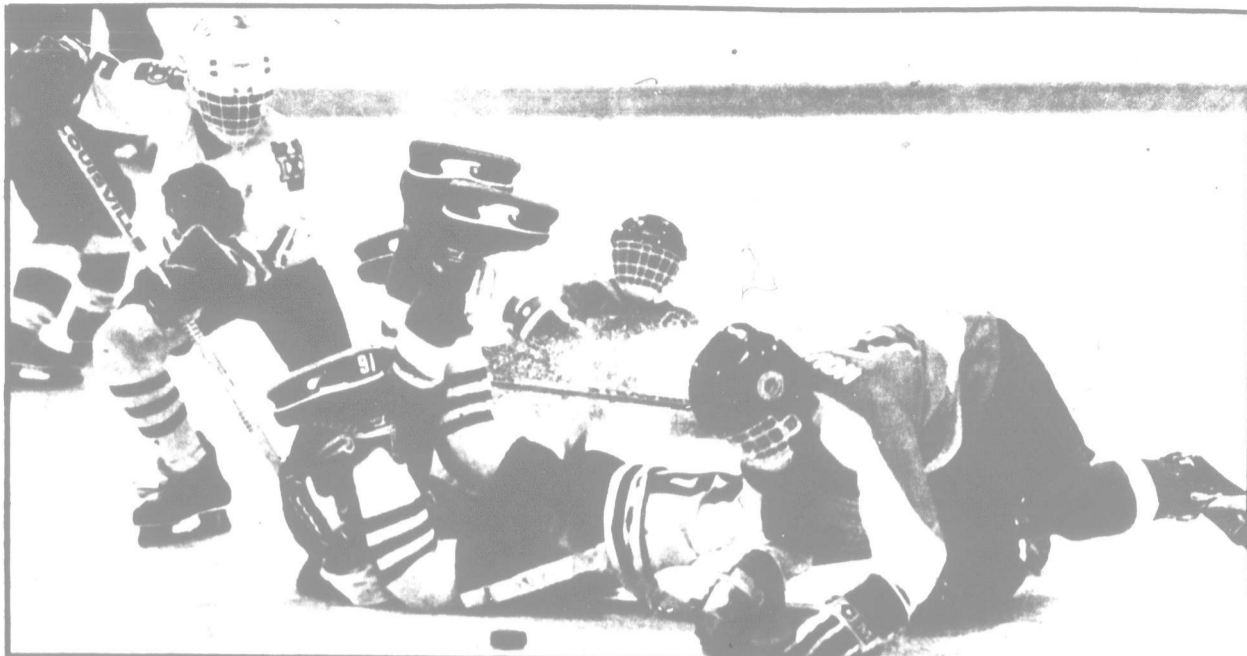

Reps drive to ESSO Cup

Nobody can say Andrew Cumming made a wrong move when he left Toronto Marlboros for Mississauga Reps at the start of the current Metropolitan Toronto Hockey League season.

The Reps defeated Quebec's Verdun Maple Leafs 5-2 to win the 1980 Maple Leaf International Major Peewee Tourna-

ment and the Esso Challenge Cup Monday at North York Centennial Arena. Cumming played a major role in the championship.

The Reps were impressed by Cumming's talents last season when the Marlbies defeated the Reps 3-1 in the Esso Cup semi-finals and also eliminated them from the MTHL playoffs.

Cumming scored five

goals during the tournament, as the Reps became the first Mississauga team to win the tournament. And in the final, Cumming was picked the game's first star. The third time he was picked one of the three stars during the tournament.

The coaching here is better, the club does more for the players and it's more fun, said Cumming, whose 20 goals this season have helped the Reps to first place in the MTHL peewee major series. "I've got all my friends here and this is a

much better team."

Cumming and his teammates proved that in the semi-finals, defeating the Marlbies 2-1 in overtime. Cumming and Dom Amodeo scored to put the Reps in the final of the prestigious tournament.

Despite Cumming's fine play at centre against the Maple Leafs, it was Mike Kolodziejczyk who stole the Reps limelight. At 8:34 of the second period, Kolodziejczyk scored to put the Reps ahead 3-1, a two-goal lead the Maple Leafs could never surmount. Kolodziejczyk also scored the

Reps fifth goal.

"We battled them and forechecked them," said Rep coach Larry Barnett. "I was never scared we'd lose and we didn't take any stupid penalties as we did in the other games."

Penalties had threatened to eliminate the Reps in earlier play. In the third and crucial quality game against Winnipeg Monarchs, Winnipeg scored two powerplay goals to lead 3-2 before Cumming, who else scored to tie the score 3-3 and put the Reps in the semi-finals.

No goals allowed, Terriers win tourney

The Terriers won the round-robin tournament after a 3-0 win over South London in the final. Ian Laurie scored two goals and Mike Mirti had one. Baliva was the shutout goalie.

In the third game, Laurie scored four goals in a 9-0 win over Hespeler. Dave Doorey had two goals and Duncan Lane, Jim Aucoin and Daryl Charanduk had singles. Grecco earned the shutout.

Baliva earned the shutout in the second game, a 3-0 win over St. Thomas. Paul Donnelly, Lane and Keith Torbar scored.

Charanduk scored two goals in the opening game, a 6-0 win over Wallaceburg. Doorey, Donnelly, Lance Bailey and Lane scored singles. Grecco was the shutout goalie.

In other tournament play, the Terrier minor atoms lost 6-1 to Metro Black Hawks, 5-2 to Kitchener and 7-1 to Brampton.

John Hendry was named most valuable player for the Terrier atoms, who played in the minor peewee division, in a 3-3 tie with Oakville. In other games, the Terriers lost 3-1 to Riverside and 9-2 to South London.

Hockey is second for touring Reps

It's hockey night in Germany for Mississauga Canada Lease Reps of the Metropolitan Toronto Hockey League.

The Reps are in Munich, West Germany, playing 10 games against nine teams from West Germany and Austria. Most of these games are being played in the evening, allowing the 16 players and five coaches the chance to take in the sights during the day.

"We were looking at Switzerland and Sweden, but the hockey in West Germany is much

better," said Rep president Bill Mosey. "The German hockey association wanted us to come and we're expecting to do well."

The Reps' MTHL record suggests Mosey may be right. The Reps lead the minor midget division with 15 wins and one tie in 23 games.

The Reps are playing nine games against local teams in the Munich area and one game in Austria

against a Salzburg team. Mosey reckons three or four of those teams will be as competitive as the Reps, but that's not the most important consideration, according to Mosey.

"The trip is for pure enjoyment," he said. "The boys (are) with the Munich team players and should pick up a bit of German. Maybe the teams will do a job on us skate-wise or in hitting. The boys may learn something, but it's hard to say."
