from the Acting Secretary of State a private letter
asking if Genada would send a representative to the
Conference, and if so would be glad if Canada could send
as delegate Mr. Hackenzie King who has investigated
recently and made a report on opium conditions in
British Columbia, in consequence of which important
legislation was passed by the Government of Canada.

"Fould be glad to be informed what answer I may return. This telegram has been repeated to Earl Grey. (8d) Howard."
