

Equally, before making new promises in this and other fields, it would be well for the Prime Minister to carry out the promises made five years ago. Unemployment was to be ended then. Nothing was said at that time about the necessity of amending the constitution towards that end. It was all to be done by more in the way of protection. Protection remains, and so does unemployment. Before we attempt to cure unemployment by experiments in some new field, might it not be well to get rid in the first instance of those experiments which already have shown themselves not only to be inadequate, but themselves the very enactments which have done more to enhance unemployment than anything else.
