Sir,

With further reference to your Requisition for May last, in which Patent is applied for Lot 28, fronting on St. John River, Tobique Reserve, in the name of Charles E. Hanson, Sale 45, I have to inform you that an Order in Council has been passed waiving the portion of the Regulations requiring fencing as part of the conditions of Sale of lands in Tobique. It will, however, be necessary, before Patent can issue in this case, to furnish the usual declaration as to the clearing of at least five Acres and the erection of a house of at least 18 by 24 feet, upon the Lot, also shewing that the land has been occupied by the purchaser either personally or by tenant for at least three years.
