Ottawa, February 5, 1914.

Rev. Sir,-

I beg to call your attention to official letters of October 17, 1911, and August 1, 1912, in reference to the improvements which were to be made to the Ermineskins Boarding School to entitle it to be placed in Class "A".

The Department is in receipt of a report from its inspector, who states that when he visited the school on the 23rd ultimo he found that the heating system was defective and did not appear to have sufficient capacity to properly heat the school. He also states that there are quite a number of changes and additions still necessary to bring this school up to the requirements of the agreement. An additional class-room is needed so that the boys can have the use of the basement for a play-room and an isolated hospital should also be provided.

The Department trusts that you will have these matters attended to, as the school is now drawing the maximum grant, which was allowed on the understanding that the school would qualify for Class "A" from the first of April, 1911. Unless the Department has your assurance in writing that the requirements referred
