- (d) who, upon being transferred from one place to another place, fails to obey any order given by a person lawfully in charge of him, or
- (e) who fails to obey an order lawfully given pursuant to subsection seven of section four hundred and thirteen,

is guilty of an offence and liable, upon indictment or summary conviction, for a first offence to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twelve months or to a fine of not less than fifty dollars and not exceeding twelve five hundred dollars, or to both such imprisonment and such fine and for any subsequent offence to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years or to a fine of not less than one hundred dollars and not exceeding one thousand dollars or to both such imprisonment and such fine.

one of this section, the Justice or Justices of the Peace, Police Magistrate, Stipendiary Magistrate, Judge or Court before whom he is so convicted shall, if counsel or other person acting for the Crown so requests, in addition to imposing the punishment direct that; therein provided for upon the expiration of his term of imprisonment, if any, such man shall be taken in police custody to a place specified by the counsel or other person acting for the Crown and delivered to the person in charge thereof.
