A. No, sir.

Q. What did you work in, battle dress?

A. No, sir.

Q. What clothes were you wearing?

A. Coveralls on top of my uniform.

Q. Did your employers ask you if you were in the army?

A. No, sir.

Q. Nobody was inquisitive?

A. No, sir.

Q. What were you wearing when you were apprehended?

A. My battle-dress.
