

# NAKUSP, BRITISH COLUMBIA

THIS booklet is compiled under auspices of the business men of Nakusp with a view of placing its advantages before the home-seeker, the intending farmer, the capitalist, and the industrial worker, who may seek such opportunities as the town, and the district of the Arrow Lakes, offer. It is confidently felt that the 'afterwar' period will find thousands of families from the British Isles seeking new fields of activity and investment and it is but natural that similar scenic and climatic conditions as they have experienced at home, should find favour in their selection of a new location.

Nakusp, and the various points along the lakes, offer these ideal climatic and profitable conditions. The town (pop. 500) is the commercial, industrial and farming centre of a beautiful lake district extending 65 miles north and 92 miles south. It is headquarters and home port of all the modern, palatial and speedy Lake steamers of the Canadian Pacific Railway. It is the western terminus of the Nakusp-Slocan-Kaslo branch of the same Railway, connecting with main line at Revelstoke and Nelson for all parts of the continent.
