which explains why the pot must be made by anyone who wishes to profit by the accessibility of pot-stone. The Kañhiryūármīūt do, however, sell a considerable number of made copper snow-knives—long two-handled double-edged knives which they and other tribes copy faithfully in iron, when the iron is available.
