THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, excepting 8 and 28, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-marter section of 100 acres, more or less.

ENTRY

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District

in which the land to be taken is a tuate, or if the homesteader dealers he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the District in which the land is attuate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. of \$10 is charged for a homestead HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted are entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:—

(i) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any persen who is eligible to make a homestead entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person tesiding with the father or mother, (3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in the manner prescribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead, if the second homestead, if the second homestead, (4) If the settler has his per-

in the vicinity of the first home stead.

(4) If the settler has his cornanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of tils Act as to residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or connecting township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2) (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with hulldings for their accommodation, and have heades as acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT.

Should be made at the end of the three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent the settler must give at: Commissioner of Dominion Lands months notice in writing to the at Ottawa of his intention to do so. INFORMATION.

INFORMATION.

Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the Immigration Office in Winnipeg, or at any Dominion Landa Office in Manitoha or the Northwest Territories, information as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and assistance in securing lands to suit them. Full information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral inwas, as well as respecting Dominion Lands in the Railway Belt in Pritish Columbia, may be obtained upon application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa; the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, Manitoba; on to any or the Dominion Lands and Manitoba or the Northwest Territories.
