Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the sum of 50l. should be granted and paid to enable the inhabitants of the Nine Mile River Settlements in Douglass, to open the road from William Chislom's farm to the bridge on the Shubenaccadie river, at Hall's, on the Cobiquid Road, leading to Halisax, a dis-

tance of eight miles, and now only twelve feet wide.

Refulved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the sum of 491. should be granted and paid, to improve the road from Silas Rand's, towards Aylesford Church, which sum was last year recommended by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, but not agreed to by His Majesty's Council. This road is, in length, sisteen miles, has near a mile to be causewayed, upwards of seven miles to be opened, and a number of bridges to be made.

Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the sum of 501. should be granted and paid for repairing the bridge (called O'Brien's bridge) over the lake,

on the road leading to Windsor.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that a further sum of 100l. should be granted and paid towards building a pier to support the bridge over Avon River.

Refolved, That it is the opinion of this Committee, that the fum of 50l. should be granted and paid to Henry Torrens, for his services, in saving the eargo of the brig Harriot, on the Island of Sable, to be paid out of the salvage allowed for the saving such cargo.

The report and resolutions were read, throughout, a sirst and second time, and,

upon the question, severally put thereupon, agreed to by the House.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the said resolutions to the Council, for their concurrence, and that he do request a present Conference by Committee, with the Council, on the subject matter thereof.

A Meffage from the Council, by Mr. Gautier: Mr. Speaker,

The Council agree to a Conference, by Committee, as requested by this House, immediately, in the Committee Room of the Council.

And then the Messenger withdrew.

Ordered, That Mr. Wilkins, Mr. Mortimer, Mr. M'Monagle, Mr. Wollen-haupt, and Mr. Chipman, do manage the faid Conference, and that they do attend accordingly.
