"Moved and seconded that a committee composed of Joseph Gibson, R. A. Whittam, F. S. Spence, E. E. Parrott, and J. W. Cooley, be appointed to draft a code of rules for political organizers to assist them in their work.

"Resolved that this alliance appreciates the action of the provincial government and legislature in making several amendments to the License Act which deal with the working of the act more effectively and notably for the securing of the enforcement of local option.

"Also we appreciate the action of the department in refusing to be bound by technicalities where it was really evident that local option had been carried at the polls.
