FAITHLESS WIFE ELOPES WITH CHILDREN

Calgary Couple Comes to Regina but is Traced by Husband who Demands his Little Ones--Not Anxious for Wife's Return

Knock, knock, on the door of a Cameron street house brought a fair woman not more than thirty-two to the door, and there she confronted her husband from whom she had eloped but a few days before with another man who is now working in Regina by day labor. She took with her two of the four children that up to the time of her leaving had, with her hubby, composed a happy home. He had not suspected that his good looking wife was sharing her affections with another man, but on Thursday last he missed her from his home at Calgary and only two of the children could be found. He was dumbfounded to learn that the woman who had less than six years before promised at the altar to love and honor him, had actually eloped and had divided the family evenly with him. He traced the couple to Regina and found that they were located north of the track. He walked the streets and eagerly scanned every place where he thought she was likely to be, but was disappointed in not getting a clue. On Monday, however he saw a woman on Dewdney street that resembled at a distance

his lost love. She went into a business place and after she came out he followed her to her home. After giving her time to get off her wraps, and so as to put her entirely off her guard, he walked around a back way and knocked. The woman was dumfounded to confront her husband, and there playing around the house were the two children. There was more meaning in the exchanged looks than the words which followed expressed, but the husband merely made a cold demand for the children. This he insisted on, and although she began to show deep contrition, he did not address her in any tone of affection and gave her to understand that he was not after her but wanted the little ones to accompany him. She would not let the children go unless he took her back also and this move on her part paved the way for reconciliation. The husband accepted a vow of fealty for the future and arrangements were made to return to Calgary on the evening train. Before six o'clock they were at the station, and when husband No. 3 arrived home he found that his bird had flown.

POLICE ORDERED TO THE MINES

SEEDING AT ABERNETHY

They are on the Land--Mr. Motherwell has Wheat in Sowing Thick to assist Growth

"We started seeding at Abernethy on Monday," said Hon. W. R. Motherwell to The West yesterday, "and while this is considered late, it is two weeks earlier than we got on the land in 1899." Mr. Motherwell said that the snowfall in his district was very much lighter than it was here, and there the land has been bare for some time. Asked if he considered it necessary to make any change in the method of seeding on account of the lateness of the season, he replied that they were sowing a little more to the acre to keep the grain from stooling, but while this will bring the wheat plant on, the head will be smaller and if the summer turns dry the plant will be weaker than it should be. This is largely, however, a matter of chance, and soil conditions at present must be taken into consideration.

REGINA CUT OFF FROM NORTH

Washouts Cause Complete Isolation--Trains From North to Lumsden--South Line Tied up

When traffic on the north line was at a standstill owing to the snow storms there was always a hope of getting out "tomorrow" but communication is now cut off from the north and the country on the other side of the Qu'Appelle is isolated. The first trouble started on Sunday evening when a doubleheader freight train went into the ditch a couple of miles out where a washout had taken place. Now, however, it is learned that the whole roadbed is in bad shape between here and Lumsden, large portions being under water. Supt. Wilcox wired the city yesterday that he will run trains regularly but he cannot say when the through traffic will be resumed as the valley is full of water. This means that the people for the north will have to drive to Lumsden which takes nearly
