All Ships Must Have Wireless.

All Canadian ships sailing for ports in the United Kingdom will be obliged in future to carry a wireless installation and wireless operators in order to conform to the requirements of an Act passed by the British Parliament. The Naval Service Department has been informed that this Act requires every sea-going British ship registered in the United Kingdom, being a passenger steamer or ship of 1600 tons gross tonnage or upwards to equip with a wireless installation. The Act comes into effect as soon as the Defense of the Realm regulations expire owing to the declaration of peace. Three months after that date any ship sailing at a port in the United Kingdom will come under the conditions of this Act, whether it is registered in Great Britain or not.

A new enemy the sea fishes have to fear is the human bird. In response to a request from the U. S. Fisheries Bureau, the Navy Department is going to undertake to scout for schools of fish with flying machines. Fish schools commonly travel at or near the surface of the sea, seeking what they may devour. To come across one is a big opportunity for the fishermen. If, therefore, the finny hordes can be located by airplanes and information duly and promptly communicated to the fishing vessels, important results, meaning full cargoes for market, should be obtained.

Some Striking Figures of Savings Deposits from Bank Statement for August

A total of \$1,196,632,931 in savings bank deposits is a gratifying report that many of the countries which have emerged from war would be glad to report to-day. This is the position of Canada as revealed in the bank statement for August.

The amount is \$181,921,966 better than the same month last year, notwithstanding the fact that a good part of it was transferred to last year's \$600,000,000 Victory Loan, and is \$21,540,778 better than July of this year.

This is a promising outlook for the Victory Loan Campaign which is at present being carried on. If the depositors in Canada's savings banks were to say the word, they could subscribe the \$300,000,000 asked nearly four times over. The success of the present effort should be overwhelming.

To Subscribe Five Millions to Loan.

Montreal, Oct. 23.—One of the first large subscriptions to the 1919 Canadian Victory Loan to be made public is that of the New York Life Insurance Company, the manager of which institution here, J. G. Pelton, stated to-night that he had been advised by the New York office that it had decided to subscribe \$5,000,000 to the new loan.

The New York Life last year took \$1,000,000 of the Victory Bonds and the decision to increase the amount to \$5,000,000 of the 1919 issue is regarded with the greatest satisfaction by the committee in charge of the forthcoming campaign here.
