Synopsis of Canadian North West Land Regulations

Any person who is the sole head of a samily, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitob Saskatchewan or Alberta, The appli-cant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sab-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or eighter of intending

Daties-Six months' residence upor and enlitvation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live ohn Millard, 400 Barrels St. within nine miles of his homestead of a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father' mother, son, daughter, brother or sis

> In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section slongside his homestead. Price

Duties-Must reside upon the home stead or pre-empfion six months in each of six years from date of home stead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has oxhauste his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchas ed homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties .- Must reside 10.30 a. m. eix months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
