HALIFAX, N.S., Feb. 8.

The Halifax sugar refinery made a hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars clear profit last year; paid one hundred thousand dollars mortgage and a dividend of thirteen per cent. The European press regards the publication of the Austro-German treaty as Bismarck's last effort to compel the Czar to refrain from attacking Austria.

At present the Russian press is advocating an alliance between Russia, England and France.

It is reported that Spain, Roumania and Sweden have concluded treaties and an alliance with Germany.

French, Belgian and Dutch syndicates are negotiating a Russian loan of two hundred millions of roubles.
