Sir: I have the honor to enclose herewith, a copy of instructions to me under date of the 8th instant, from the Acting Secretary of State, Washington, by which it will be observed I am requested to inform the people of Newfoundland that the people of the United States appreciate deeply the courtesy and co-operation extended to the crews and officers of the aircraft and surface craft during their stay in Newfoundland.

A copy of the instructions has also been handed to the Secretary of the Municipal Council of St. John's, and I will greatly appreciate such publicity as you may deem proper to give, regarding its contents.



**BERNARD PARSONS.**

Mr. Bernard Parsons, one of the most highly respected citizens of St. John's, passed away at that place on Tuesday afternoon last after a brief illness. Deceased who was a blacksmith by trade, is survived by four sons—Victor, Ephraim and Arthur in Harbor Grace—and George in British Columbia—and one daughter, Mrs. Webber, in the U. S. Mr. Parsons took a very active interest in the doings of the Methodist Church in Harbor Grace during the last half century and for forty years was Supt. of the Sunday Schools there. He was a man of rare ability, a splendid conversationalist with a perfect knowledge of local affairs, and truly honest in all his dealings. In his passing the Methodist Church of Harbor Grace loses one of its most prominent members, and the dominion one of its best citizens. Just two short months ago, Mrs. Parsons passed away, the shock of her death, no doubt precipitating the demise of her husband. To all the relatives and friends, the Telegram proffers sympathy.


