Cents for Supplies. (Boston News Bureau, July 28th.) BOSTON-Copper continues in acve demand for bothe domestic and export account at 12% cents. Consumers have put out additional inquiries and further inquiries come from foreign buyers. Recent sales were on a substantial scale for European shipment, and 1% cents alongside ship at New York was paid. A broader demand is developing daily lately. Sellers are finding buyers more ready to operate since the market has begun to harden. Some holders are inclined to shut down on further sales below 13 cents. Exports of copper from New York during the first three weeks of this

month amounted to 25,883,200 pounds.




