An analysis of the different prizes given at the exhibition of 1871 brings out some curious facts which go to show that the entries made at the Provincial Exhibitions are chiefly drawn from a comparatively circumscribed sur-rounding district of country, and that consequently these gatherings should, as at present, be of a circulating character, so that the different districts, in turn, may enjoy the benefit of their presence, and the stimulus which multitudes of spectators, valuable prizes, and keen competition naturally secure.

At Kingston, in '71, there were five counties which did not gain a single prize, and from the character and enterclusion is natural that this resulted from none belonging to these localities entering as competitors. When such counties as Keat, Lambton, Norloki, Russell, and Stormont are all in this condition, only one reason can be given for the fact. Other counties roceived only one or two prizes of insignificant value, while Frontenachad 512, to the amount of \$2,071,50; Ontario 104, of the value of \$1,219; and York 202, valued at \$1,821.50. In the former year, when the exhibition was in Toronto, Frontenac only gained nin prizes, of the value of \$39,50, while York had 655, worth \$3,434.50. It must be noted, at the same time, that certain localities keep their ground very fairly wherever the exhibition may happen to the. For instance, Wellington had only a hundred dollars more of prizes in Toronto than it carried off in Kingston. It was in both instances far ahead in cattle of any other county in the Province. In 1871 this county received for cattle 48 prizes, of the united value of \$864, while the next highest in the value of the prizes got only \$510. For horses, York took the lead, followed, though at a conciderable distance, by Durham and Ontario. Other localities have likewise noticeable specialties. For instance, Halton and Peel took more than half of all the prizes that were given for hogs, while they had scarcely any standing for anything else.
