 Spray No. 2—Po. Lime Sulphur 1 lb. Po. Lead Arsenate 1 lb.
 Spray No. 1—Po. Lime Sulphur 12 lbs. to 40 gal. of Water. to 40 gallons of water.

Fruit and Pest	Time of Application	The Spray to use
Apple and Pear Scales, Cancer, Blister Mite, Aphis, Scab, Bud-moth, Codling Moth, Chewing Insects.	1—Just before buds burst in Spring.	1—Use S 1
	2—Just before the blossoms open.	2—Use S 2.
	3—Immediately after blossoms fall. Don't wait till they all fall off.	3—Use S 2.
	4—Two weeks later.	4—Use S 2.


CANADIAN COW WORLD'S CHAMPION FOR BUTTER
 Preliminary reports of the supervisors in charge indicate that the cow, Rolo Mercena DeKol, 30313, has gained the world's championship for butter in the 7 day and 30 day divisions. While the figures may be slightly changed when the official reports are received from Prof. Dean, the supervisors' reports show her production to be as follows:—

	Milk	Butter
1 day	125.8	8.57
7 days	738.7	51.93
30 days	2920.5	200.34
60 days	5795.1	337.49

This cow is owned by Mr. J. B. Hamner, of Norwich, Ontario, and her age at calving was 5 years 6 months and 15 days. Her best seven days, the duration of which was about equally divided between two supervisors, was made at the close of the sixty day period.
 In connection with the record of Rolo Mercena DeKol there are three striking features. The first is that a Canadian bred cow, with several generations of purely Canadian ancestry behind her, should establish a new world's record in both the seven-day and thirty-day classes. Canadian breeders may justly rejoice over this new honor, one of the many creditable laurels won since the day when Alta Posch set up a world's record for butter as a senior two year old I need only recall May Echo Sylvia, world's champion for milk from one to one hundred days; Carnation King Sylvia, world's record holder for cattle of all ages and breeds in the matter of price; Het Loo Pietertje, champion junior two year old for butter for seven, thirty and sixty days Mildred Pietertje Abbeker, champion senior four year old for milk; Colony Aaggie Pietertje, champion two year old for one year under strictly official test; Zarilda Clothilde 3rd DeKol, until recently champion mature cow for milk in strictly official test; Lakeview Dutchland Calamity Rose, champion two year old with first calf and Miss La Honda, champion butter cow in fair ground test, to show that, considering the number of cattle owned in Canada, our breeders have done their part to place this country on the Holstein map. The remarkable yearly record soon to be announced for Mr. Houck's great cow, Jemima Johanna of Riverside, will bring new
