Fowler, who had charge of the mission field in Inwood and Brooke for the past eight months is leaving to resume evangelistic work in the West. The Presbytery meets next in Stratford on the second Tuesday in September.

Asphalting Wolfe Street.

Those In Favor of It Are in a Big Majority.

They Appear at the Court of Revision - Macadamising on Dufferin Avenue.

Most of the ratepayers on Wolfe street appeared at the court of revision yesterday, reinforced by their lawyer, Mr. W. J. Clarke, to back up their petition for an asphalt pavement. The assessment commissioner reported that the petitioners for the pavement represented \$50,000 in assessment, and those against it \$12,250. The latter and their respective assessments were: Thomas Higgins, \$1,000; Edward Lee, \$3,500; John Williams, \$5,000; J. A. Sutherland, \$2,500; and Philip Pocock, \$1,050.

The city engineer estimates that the pavement will cost \$275,400, of which the city will pay \$427.75. The petition now goes before the Board of Works, who will carry it into effect. The present block pavement has been down on Wolfe street six years and is in a disgraceful condition. A petition for a drain on the same street was presented to the court. Those petitioning for it represented \$38,800, and those against, \$27,250. It is not to be used for closing.

Badly Bungled.

The Reeve Says London West's Assessment Rolls Are in That Shape.

A Special Meeting Called, Which Proved to be Bogus.

Because the Clerk Had Not Specified Its Purpose - An Assessor Speaks in Self-Defense.

Last night's special meeting of the London West Council was a bogus one, and it didn't take long for the village fathers to find this out. The meeting was called for 8 o'clock, and when the councillors assembled they found the gates of the school house locked and the place in darkness. This caused them to be called the members to order and said that one of the reasons he had called the meeting was in regard to last year's assessment roll. It seems that Mr. Simpson had gone over the roll and had found some mistakes which were of a very serious character. Just how the errors occurred he was not in a position to say. The blunder said one thing, and the roll said another. The only way he could account for the mistakes was in copying the roll out of the blotter. The thing had to be fixed, and they might as well get at it and do it. W. D. Cushing was only assessed for half an acre instead of three acres. Mr. Kipp was assessed for \$50, and only appeared to have \$50 on the roll. Then there were two lots on St. Paul street belonging to Catherine Friend which were not assessed at all.

Deputy Reeve Moore - I know I am called a kicker, but no special business should be transacted until the council has been notified of the meeting called for the purpose. Any action taken tonight will be illegal, because the clerk neglected to say what the business was.

Reeve Saunby - I was surprised when I saw the notices sent out on Monday night. The meeting had been called for, the matter could have been dealt with.

The meeting then named next Wednesday night as the one for all the trouble, and notices will be sent out stating the business of the council.

Mr. Heavey - I will not be able to attend tonight's meeting on Wednesday night. As one of last year's assessors, I might say that if there are any errors in the roll you can blame the council of last year. We never got any help from them at all. We were two green men, and the council didn't give us any assistance. They didn't

even give us a map to find out where the lots were. We didn't even get a blotter. I think you will find out that the roll is just the same as the notices sent out, which were taken from the blotter.

Councillor Duff thought there was too much "hunker-sliding" about the whole business.

Mr. Moore thought the court of revision was the proper place to have things rectified, but Reeve Saunby and Mr. Duff thought that the ones who made the mistakes should make them right.

Mr. Duff said that if a man owned \$800 worth of property and was only assessed for \$400, as was the case in some places on the roll, he would hardly go to the court of revision and appeal to have it increased.

On account of the unsatisfactory notices the Board of Works did not sit, but a notice was read requesting the reeve and his deputy to attend at the county chambers on July 27 to consider the division of the county into electoral districts for representation on the county council.

The opinion prevailed that it made little difference about them, and that they would go in with the township.
