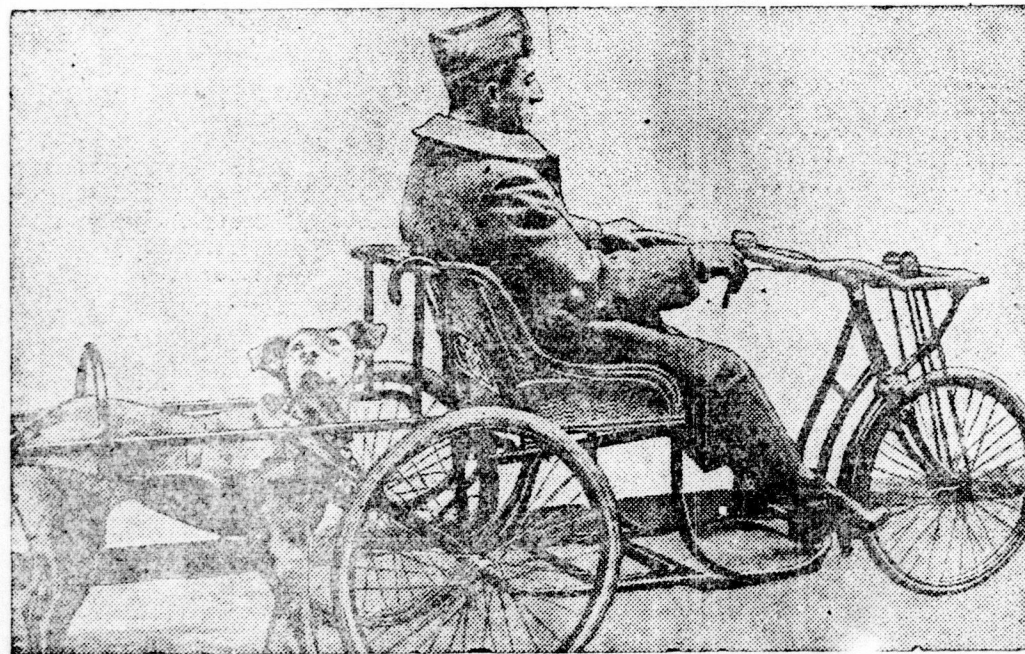

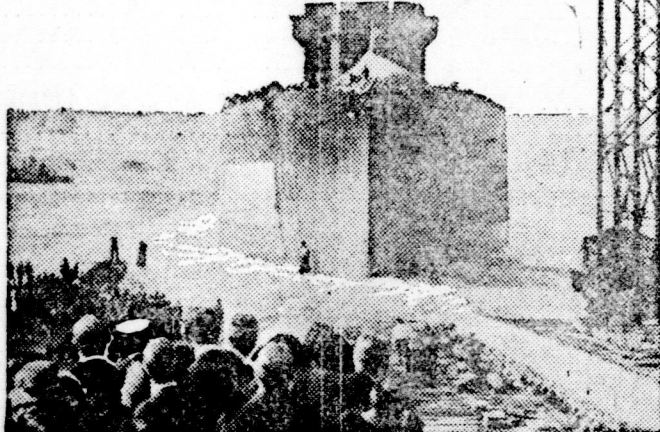

Crippled Soldier Travels by Dogmobile



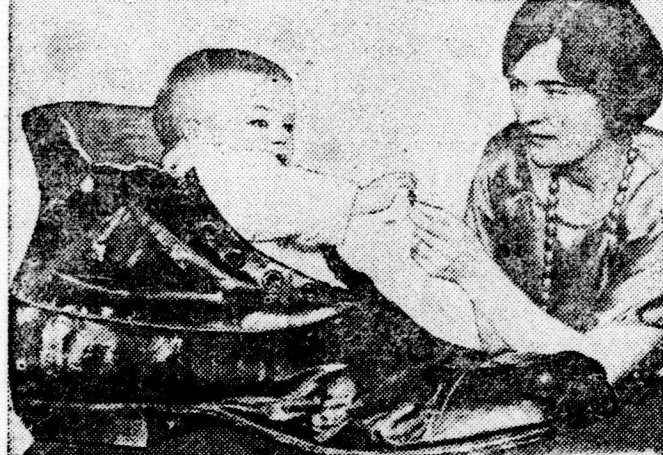
BELGIAN who lost the use of his legs in the war uses his dog, Bruno, to help him move around.

New Ship May Not Ride Breakers For Long



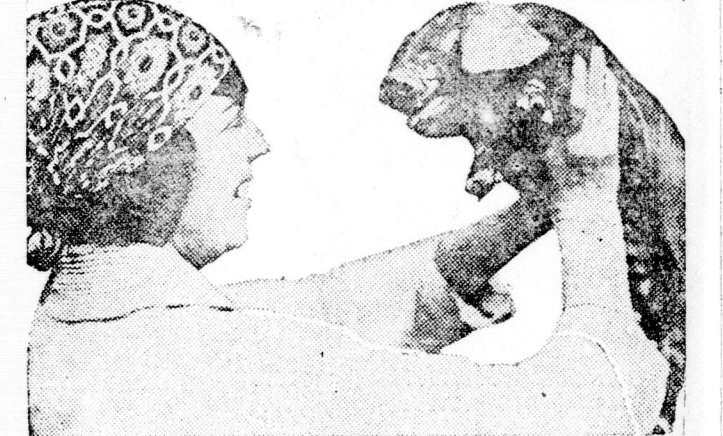
