TO CUT LAW'S DELAYS.

British Commission Report on Legal Obstructions.

LONDON, Dec. 16. — Sweeping changes in the administration of law are recommended by the royal commission on Delays in Law Courts, whose final report was issued last night. Some of the most striking proposals are: Abolition of grand juries; long vacation to be reduced to two months; no Assize to be held unless there are three prisoners; judges in London to sit longer hours; "sandy trial list" to be formed of cases where there is no defence; judges to retire at the age of 65 years, or after six months' absence; judges to be allowed to sit for a year in case of temporary illness. The court of Criminal Appeal is to have power to order a new trial. Dealing with delays in London and lengthy trials, reference is made to the growing tendency to adjourn cases for the convenience of "fashionable counsel," who like to "spread themselves over a trial for weeks." There will be little disagreement with the chief proposals of the report.

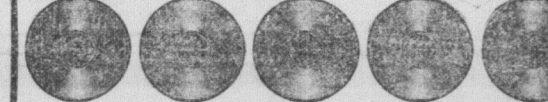
