The Columbia and Rosedale Co.
It was stated yesterday that Atkinson & Co. had transferred their charter for the British Columbia & Rosedale railway to the Columbia Pacific. Mr. Reid, a large contractor, has been engaged to inspect the route and report on the company. Work may commence tomorrow.

Accident on the S. & N. Railway.
A fall of rock occurred yesterday in deep cut south of Nanaimo and the engine of the train from Nanaimo was thrown off the track by striking the rocks. The engine was damaged to the extent of \$1,000. There were no casualties to passengers or train men.

The Steamer North Pacific.
The Steamer North Pacific has been temporarily withdrawn from the route in order that an inspection may be made of her machinery, her place being taken by the Steamer North Pacific. The inspection was made at her wharf here last evening in charge of Capt. Roberts, having made the run from Port Townsend to Seattle. She has been greatly improved since she was taken off the route about six months ago.

Castleship.
The Steamer North Pacific, a young gentleman well known in this city, and who was for some time paymaster on the Canadian Pacific railway, and now book-keeper for Harris & Dickson in Seattle, was kidnapped and robbed shortly after midnight on Sunday.
