**GREAT TRIUMPH IN CHURCH DRIVE**

Total of \$12,321,089 Raised by United Effort Throughout Dominion.

Toronto, Ont. 21.—With 99 per cent of the amount aimed at reached, and much more to come, enthusiasm ran high at the headquarters of the Inter-church Forward Movement. The total for the Dominion last night—the last day for the great drive—reached \$11,321,089, the objective being \$11,440,000. Of this amount \$710,000 was contributed by the Province of Ontario and \$2,475,144 by the City of Toronto. The Methodists led with a total of \$5,266,164 or 6.6 per cent over their objective.
