New York, Sept. 20.—Custom officers to-day went to the house of ex-Mayor and Congressman Alfred C. Chapin of Brooklyn, who is alleged to have violated several laws by leaving the steamer Fuerst Bismarck at quarantine and seized the baggage he and his wife took from the vessel. They are treated as ordinary smugglers. The captain of the vessel has been ordered to appear before the officials before he sails. He is liable, it is said, to imprisonment and fine of \$1000.
