THE VICTORY WON. A brief memorial of the last days of G. R. By the author of the "Me. moir of Captain H. Vicare." New York: R. Carter & Brothers. Sold by D. McLellan, Hamilton, and J. C. Geikie, Toronto.

This little volume contains a deeply interesting and beautifully written memorial of one, who, almost at the last hour was brought from darkness light, to and from the power of Satan, to the knowledge, love, and obedience of the living God. The narrative may illustrate the efficacy of prayer, and the power of the Gospel when accompanied by the influence of the Spirit, and may tend to encourage Christians to seek the spiritual good of those to whom they may have access.

SYNOD OF PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

This Synod met lately at St. John's. There was a considerable amount of business before the Court, a large proportion of it being connected with the Home Missionary operations.

The subject of Sabbath observance was laid hefore the Synod, and means adopted to collect and diffuse information on the subject.

A report was given in on the subject of Education, from which it appeared that progress had been made in the establishment of an Educational Institute at Woodstock. The Rev. Mr. Glass was loosed from his charge for six weeks and deputed to advocate this object in the northern part of the

Collections were appointed for Jewish and Foreign Missions; for the Sustentation Fund; for the Home Mission; and for the Incidental Fund.

A Committee was re-appointed with the view of carrying out a union with the Free Church of Nova Scotia.

SYNOD OF UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH.

In the July number of the United Presbyterian Magazine, we find a notice of part of the proceedings of this Court. The opening sermon was preached by the Rev. Mr. Torrence of Guelph, and Rev. Mr. Duff was appointed to succeed him as Moderator. Reports were given by Preebyteries as to the changes which had taken place during the year. It appeared that six preachers had been settled during the year, and that one had become unfit for the duties of preaching.

An overture, proposing a change in the formula for Ministers and Elders at Ordination was taken up, but it was resolved to decline entertaining the prayer of this eventure.

A new Presbyzery was formed celled the Presbytery of Brant, comprising various congregations around Owen Sound.
