FLOUR.—The arrivals have not been equal to the demand. There has been good demand for all grades, especially good strong Superfine, which has been sold for local use as high as \$5.16. Bag Flour is in great request, and has brought as high as \$235.

BUTTER.—The market is now firmer, and good butter is scarce. Coloco is enquired after, but there is little in the market. Several lots have been shipped to Britain during the week, which has caused prices slightly to improve.

PETROLEUM.—The markets continue dull, with little domand, prices ranging from 30c. to 325c. per gallon.
