TO CLEAN FURNITURE. One pint linseed oil, one pint vinegar, half-int of wine or alcohol.

NICKEL trimmings can be kept bright by rubbing with a woollen cloth saturated with spirits of ammonia.

FRUIT SNATS.—One and a half cupfuls of sugar, one cupful of butter, one half cupful of molasses, three eggs, one teaspoonful of soda, a cupful of raisins, two cupfuls of currants, one tablespoonful of ginger, one tablespoonful of cloves, one tablespoonful of cinnamon and one tablespoonful of allspice; mix soft as can be rolled. These will keep several months.
