NEWS OF THE MINES.

THE BOUNDARY COUNTRY.

Mr. Ross Thompson, from the Bou dary Creek country, is very favorably impressed with the Oro Denoro. He reports that some ore is being taken out of the property, so that it will be ready to ship on to the smelter as soon as the railroad is finished. It is thought it will be tapped when the crosscut has been run for a distance of about 100 feet.

PAYNE WORK SUSPENDED.

As per instructions received from head-quarters in Montreal, operations have been suspended in the Payne mine. There were seventeen miners and four carmen working underground, running the No. 5 tunnel east and weat, and driving an upraise from No. 4 to No. 3. These men were all laid off and only a few men on surface work remain at the mine. When spoken to, Superintendent Hand stated that he did not know the intention of the company regarding future operations, but he gave it as his opinion that the lay-off was on account of the action of the miners' union in inducing the men recently imported from Montreal to come down the hill.
