OBJECT.

This Company is to be formed for the purpose of acquiring the property known as Lorne Park, and making it a first-class summer resort.

The property consists of 75 acres of elevated woodland, and commands a splendid view of Lake Ontario. It is 14 miles from Toronto and 24 from Hamilton, it is equally accessible by rail or water, and is one of the healthiest places in Ontario. The G.T.R. track runs within 200 yards of the Park gate, and there is a substantial wharf on the lake front of the grounds.
