

To Harass Canada.

The United States Supreme court holds in an opinion rendered by Justice Field, that a tax levied by the state of Maine m the gross receipts of the Grand Trunk Railway Company of Canada for the privilege of exercising its franchises within the state of Maine was legal and constitutional and was not contrary to the provisions of the constitution pro hibiting the states from regulating state commerce. Four justices dissented and five signed the opinion. The tax levied ranged between one quarter of one per cent. and 3; per cent. of the gross per cent. and 3; per cent. of the gross receipts per annum and amounted to \$9,569 in 1881 and \$12,095 in 1882. The tax is an excise tax for the privilege of exercising the railroad franchises within the state of Maine, and is so declared in the statute.

A Valuable Find.

What may prove to be a very valuable find, and one of great importance to the Gatineau Valley Railway, has been made on the farm of G.S. Macfarlane, fifteenth line of Hull Township, on the Gatineau river, opposite the Cascades, about sixteen miles from Ottawa. Macfarlane had been prospecting for mics, and after settling a shot one of the men who was working for him, an old miner, got under a tree out of the way of the explosion. At the foot of the tree he noticed a curious rock cropping, and, examining it chipped off a piece, which he pronounced contained copper and nickel. Macfar lane took the sample to Ottawa on Satur-day and had it tested by experts, who declare that it is a very fine specimen of liarete and contains a large percentage

said that the idea of the inder of the Church was not an Italian, International Catholic affair, and the Pope's claim to full sovereignt his own territory was perfectly legitin. Prince Windiscot Gractz, in reply, pressed his personal syr pathy wo Herr Von Zallinger's views, and hope that the question of the Pope's tempora-power would be peaceably settled in a Catholic sense by Italy itself. Count Kalnoky subsequently addressed the Delegation. He said that as the great majority of the population of Austria-Hungary belonged to the Roman Catholic religion, the Government was anxious that the Pope should be completely independent. It was also his wish that peace should prevail between the Papace and the Italian Government. the Papacy and the Italian Government. The people of Austria-Hungary also desired to live in peace with Italy. The alliance with Italy, Count Kalnoky concluded, forms the basis of our policy.— Dublin Freeman.
