The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Paul Martin, today announced the following appointments in the Canadian diplomatic service:

Mr. Jean Bruchési, who has been Canadian Ambassador to Spain and Morocco, to be Ambassador to Argentina and accredited concurrently to Paraguay and Uruguay.

Mr. John Maybee, to be Canadian Ambassador to Lebanon.

Mr. Bruce Williams, who has been Canadian Ambassador to Turkey, to be Assistant Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs.

Mr. Bruchési was born in Montreal on April 9, 1901, and is a graduate of the University of Montreal and of the Ecole Libre des Sciences politiques de Paris. He has also studied at the Sorbonne and at the Ecole des Chartes, Paris, and has taught at the University of Montreal, Laval University, the University of Paris and the Institut des Sciences politiques, Paris. In 1937 Mr. Bruchési was appointed Under-Secretary of State of the Province of Quebec, a position which he held until his appointment, in 1959, as Canadian Ambassador to Spain.

Mr. Bruchési is the founder of the Société des Ecrivains Canadiens, and is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada, of which he was President in 1953. He has also served
