PRAYERS.

The Clerk of the House laid upon the Table the Fourth Report of the Clerk of Petitions, stating that he had examined the following petitions presented on the 18th instant, and finds that all the requirements of Standing Order 68 have been complied with in each case, namely:—

Of the St. Lawrence and Adirondack Railway Company, of Ottawa, Ontario, praying for the passing of an Act to authorize the extension of the lease of its railway to the New York Central Railroad Company.—*Mr. Chevrier (Stormont)*.

Of Louise Isabell Sutherland Chaplin, of Montreal, Quebec, praying for the passing of an Act to declare her marriage with Henry William Chaplin, of Montreal, Quebec, to be dissolved, and that she be divorced from him.—*Mr. Walsh*.

Mr. Dunning, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, —Copies of Orders in Council passed under the provisions of the Supplementary Public Works Construction Act, 1935, 25-26 George V, Chapter 34, Section 11—Department of Finance.

Mr. Rogers, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, —Copies of Orders in Council passed under the provisions of the Relief Act, 1934, and the Relief Act, 1935, as follows:—

Order in Council, P.C. 384, dated February 19, 1936: providing for a change in the description of two bridges to the cost of which the Dominion had agreed to contribute under an agreement entered into between the Dominion and the province of Manitoba on September 20, 1935, across the Assiniboine river near the Town of Virden (Sproats Bridge), and over Pine River at or near Camperville.

Order in Council, P.C. 397, dated February 19, 1936: authorizing payment to the province of Quebec of the sum of \$291.99 for relief purposes.
