EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Union Jack is usually raised in the presence of Her Majesty the Queen of Canada or Her Representative on public occasions or ceremonies, but as Her Majesty the Queen of Canada is the Head of the Canadian State and acts in this country as such, there seems to be no objection that the Canadian Flag be raised in the presence of the Head of our country, as would the flag usually raised according to established practice.
