People of the middle classes still have to pay taxes levied in May, 1942. I refer to the tax on soft drinks. I have stated that this tax is levied against people of the middle classes, because they are the heaviest buyers of this commodity. To ascertain this fact, it is only necessary to inquire from the manufacturers or from the corner store. It will be seen that three-quarters of this tax, if not more, is paid by the middle classes. These taxes must also be considered from the viewpoint of the soft drink manufacturers in our respective constituencies. I have already

urged in this house the removal of this tax and I have sent my request directly to the minister concerned. I am told that several of my colleagues have made similar representations. I was informed later on that an investigation had shown that income from this source had not decreased, on the whole, during the last fiscal year.

Mr. Speaker, in order to stay within the time allotted to me, I would like, with your permission, to include two comparative statements, that will supplement my remarks.
