FOOD AND DRUGS ACT AMENDMENT

PROVISIONS TO INCLUDE SOAPS, CLEANERS, PAINTS AND DYES

Mr. Warren Allmand (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce) moved for leave to introduce Bill No. C-256, to amend the Food and Drugs Act.

Some hon. Members: Explain.

Mr. Allmand: Mr. Speaker, the Food and Drugs Act presently protects consumers in respect of the sale of food, drugs, cosmetics and devices. The act protects them against hazardous substances which might endanger health and also protects them against deceptive advertising and fraudulent selling. The purpose of this bill is to extend this protection to the sale of soaps, detergents, cleaners—fabrics and clothing—and paints and dyes.

Motion agreed to and bill read the first time.
