The Select Committee appointed to examine and report upon the Contingent Accounts

of the Senate for the existing first Session, beg leave to make their first Report,-

1. That with the exception of the appointment of Clerk of the Senate, Usher of the Black Rod and Sergeant-at-Arms, which are considered to be Crown officers, all other offices of the Senate, as well as all salaries of officers, are and ought to be in the appointment of the Senate and under the control of the Senate.

2. That no Officer of the Senate should be liable to be displaced, except by order of

the Senate

3. That the duties of Sergeant-at-Arms to the Senate, as well as those of Usher of the

Black Rod, may, and should be discharged by the same individual.

4. Your Committee do not recognize the existence of any Officer or Servant of the Senate at the opening of the Session, with the exception of Crown appointments above referred to, and they propose at an early day to report, for the consideration of the Senate, such a staff of Officials, with such Salaries as they may think necessary for the efficiency of this branch of the Legislature.
