Sing these verses pronouncing the vowels or diphthongs in the syllables italicised, first briefly, and then fully, and note the difference.

7. In singing, a fulness and roundness of the vowel is often desirable; which in mere reading would be unnecessary.

8. Practice the music in strict time, a little faster than it ought to be sung.

9. Be careful not to tail the notes into one another, sing so :

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
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
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10. Let the Leader count the time. If the tune drags, let the whole of the singers once or twice sing and count together, thus :



Remembering that the first note of every bar ought to be accented or emphasised.
