RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- All grain and vegetables must have been grown by the exhibitor in 1886, and articles of manufacture must be the work of the exhibitor, and every animal to be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
- None but members of the Society will be allowed to compete for prizes.
- Membership secured on payment of £1 to the Secretary before the 1st of October, after that date two dollars will be charged.
- No person will be allowed to interfere with the judges during examination.
- Should there be any animal or article exhibited without competition it must be of such description as the judges shall approve or the owner shall not be entitled to a premium.
- In all classes, except live stock, only one entry can be made of the kind of article, but exhibitors will have the privilege of showing as many articles as they choose under one entry.
- Horses exhibited in teams cannot compete singly.

- No article or animal shall necessarily entitle its owner to a prize unless deemed worthy by the Judges.
- Should any dispute occur, the Treasurer shall hold the premium until it is settled.
- The Secretary will be at his office, next door to the post office, Minden, on the Saturday and Monday previous to show, to receive subscriptions and entries; also on grounds from 8 to 10 a. m. Show Day, to receive entries and issue tickets, after which hour no entries can be made.
- All articles exhibited are to remain on the grounds until after 4 p. m.; any person breaking this rule to forfeit their prize money.
- Any person found damaging or stealing any article on exhibition, or making any disturbance on or near the grounds during the exhibition will be prosecuted.
- Admission to show—For adults, 10c; children, under 12 years, 5c.
- Profiteers will be paid in full.
