An Act respecting the Northwest Commercial Travellers' Association of Canada.

WHEREAS, by chapter 50 of the statutes of 1887 of the province of Manitoba, The Northwest Commercial Travellers' Association of Canada, hereinafter called "the Association," was incorporated for the purposes and with the powers in the said statute mentioned; and whereas a petition has been presented by the Association praying that it be granted express authority to carry on throughout Canada its business as authorized by the said statute, and also praying that certain amendments to the said statute be made: Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, declares and enacts as follows:—

1. The Northwest Commercial Travellers' Association of Canada is hereby recognised as a corporation with all the rights, powers and privileges of a corporation incorporated by the laws of Canada, and is hereby authorized and empowered to carry on and transact its business throughout Canada as if the Association had been incorporated for its corporate purposes under the laws of Canada, and is hereby declared to have the capacity to carry on its said business in and throughout Canada; provided that the said capacity hereby granted to the Association shall be exercised, in the several provinces and Territories of Canada in which the Association may carry on its business, subject to all the general laws of the said provinces or territories applicable to the Association.

2. Section 5 of the said chapter 50 of the statutes of 1887 of the province of Manitoba is hereby amended by striking out all the words down to and including the words "Directors of the Association" and inserting in lieu thereof the words: "The Executive Committee of the Association shall have full power in all things to administer the affairs of the Association, and may make or cause to be made for the Association any description of contract which the Association may by law enter into, and the said Executive Committee shall be composed of the president, six vice-presidents, a treasurer, the directors".
