Mr. Bishop recommended an offer of \$10,000, and the lot 25 feet wide. Carried.

Take notice that application will be made to the Legislature of the Province of Ontario at its next session, on behalf of the Town of North Toronto for an Act:

(a) To repeal sub-section 5 of chap. 114, 9 Edw. VII. (1900), except as to water-mains already commenced, and to substitute for such sub-section a clause enabling the said town to extend its water-mains as local improvements under the provisions of the Local Improvement Section of the Municipal Act, being chap. 83, 1 George V. (1911), and to levy the whole cost thereof (except for flank ages and street intersections), by frontage tax on the properties benefited.

(b) To have it declared that sec. 14, chap. 83, 10 Edw. VII. (1901), respecting the assessment of farm lands in towns and villages shall no longer be applicable to the said town.

(f) To enable the Council to enforce a fee clause in all corporation contracts.

(g) To enable the Council to regulate the size of building lots within the town.

(h) To amend the Land Transfer Act, chap. 23, R.S.O. 1897, by extending the limit mentioned in section 1 of that act from ten miles to thirty miles.

BARRE, Jan. 26.—(Special.)—On more than one occasion the large tract of waste land northeast of Alliston has been spoken of as a site for a permanent training camp for the militia. The new minister of militia, Hon. S. Hughes, has taken the matter up and is making a personal enquiry into the situation.
