

LEGISLATION SENT TO MR. GREENWAY

Through Lieut-Gov. Patterson to Mr. Greenway

WITH A VIEW TO A COMPROMISE

Regarding the Troublesome School Question.

The Manitoba Premier and His Supporters in the Legislature Will Place No Obstacles in the Way, and Concessions are Likely to be Made to Remove the Matter from the Federal Arena--The Legislature Will Not Pass a Bill Until After April 15th to Receive the Result of the Conference and Take Legislative Action if Necessary.

Ottawa, March 18--(Special)--Information came into the possession of your correspondent last evening of a new turn regarding the Manitoba schools matter. What was a subject of confidence may be made public now, and to-night it is known by a few that the wires last night conveyed to Premier Greenway, through Lieut-Governor Patterson, an invitation to join with the Dominion Government on the school question, with a view to reaching a compromise and removing this troublesome question from the arena of Federal politics. As soon, therefore, as the Remedial Bill had passed its second reading, Mr. Dickey and probably Sir Charles Tupper, Bart., will leave for Winnipeg to confer with Mr. Greenway.

A prominent Manitoban, who is in town and who is pretty well posted as to the progress of events in the Prairie Province, said to-night that Mr. Greenway would concede certain hours in which religious instruction might be taught by any denomination in the schools, and that the authorized text books would be so modified as to eliminate anything therefrom which would be objectionable to Catholics.

Sir Charles Tupper, Bart., received a telegram from Winnipeg to-night, intimating that a private meeting of Mr. Greenway's supporters in the Legislature was held this afternoon, at which it was decided to place no obstacles in the way of the proposed conference. On the contrary the Legislature, instead of proroguing to-morrow, will adjourn until April 15th to receive the result of the conference and take legislative action if necessary.

THE POSITION AT WINNIPEG.

Manitoba's Legislature Must Review Any Arrangement the Premier Makes--Winnipeg, March 18--(Special)--Premier Greenway has spoken, and another milestone has been passed in the Manitoba school question has been passed. In the Legislature this afternoon Mr. Greenway gave notice of his intention to place no obstacles in the way of the proposed conference. On the contrary the Legislature, instead of proroguing to-morrow, will adjourn until April 15th to receive the result of the conference and take legislative action if necessary.

It is learned that the invitation for the conference was made by Mr. Greenway early this morning from Lieut-Governor Patterson. A caucus of Government supporters was held at noon, and the course outlined above was decided on, though all the members of the Legislature are not in the city. It would appear from the developments to-day that the members of the Legislature are not in the city to make any material concessions to the minority at the dictation of the Ottawa authorities, and that they have consented to a conference in the belief that Mr. Greenway could be trusted to carry out the course of action, reviewing any arrangement made, hence the adjournment of the Legislature instead of prorogation.

GOSSIP AT THE CAPITAL.

Will the Montreals Agree to Postpone Their Exhibition Next Year?--Ottawa, March 18--(Special)--There is a prospect of a lively fight between Montreal and Ottawa over the proposed Dominion Exhibition to be held in Montreal next year. The Montreal authorities are anxious to postpone the exhibition until 1898 or 1899. It is felt there is no chance of a postponement next year for her exhibition. Now that the Montreal authorities have taken through, the least that they can do is to hamper Toronto.

Canada and the West Indies.--Mr. D. Budge, Superintendent of the Halifax and St. John's Cable Company, is in the city interviewing the Dominion authorities in view of the granting of a subsidy to enable him to extend the cable from Halifax to St. John's. Mr. Budge says that the Dominion authorities are not in a hurry to grant the subsidy, and that he is anxious to see the Dominion Government take the initiative in increasing the trade between Canada and the British West Indies.

To Help the Dying Armenians.--The Presbytery of Algoma, through Mr. Charlton, M.P., presented a petition to the House of Commons on behalf of the Armenians of Armenia. It says that the Armenians of that country have not yet received any relief from any civilized power, and that the British Government ought to pass a resolution asking the Russian Government to permit the Armenians to express their sense of the grievous wrong of England's inaction. The petition was signed by a couple of verses of "God Save the Queen."

Sir Richard Has the Epitaph.--An epitaph is being written in Ottawa. Many M.P.'s, Senators and other public men are among its victims. Sir James Grant treated the subject in his practice to-day. Sir Richard Croft is one of the distinguished sufferers.

Calling Toronto Men Names.--The Senate spent the afternoon discussing the proposed Canadian Historical Exhibition to be held in Toronto on the fourth and fifth anniversaries of the discovery of Canada by Cabot. Several features of the bill were objected to, and the committee reported progress without having done the bill in the afternoon. Several names were said to have been heard of the bill, and the bill showed that name would get the Ontario capital.

Honest From the Yukon Country.--The Government's action in sending a mounted police force into the Yukon country is more than justified by the results.
