THEY WERE FOR ACQUITTAL. Jury in Trial of R. W. Wilson, Charged with Blackmail, Could Not Agree.

WRIT AGAINST DR. LANGSTAFF Is Charged with Having Criminal Conversation With Wilson's Wife—The Sessions.

A disagreement is the result of the trial in the Criminal Sessions of Robert Warren Wilson of Richmond Hill, charged with attempting to extort money by threats from Dr. Ralph Langstaff of the same place. The jury stood 9 for acquittal and 3 for conviction.
